The Session of JPC met on April 20, 2021 for its monthly stated meeting. Below are the highlights from that meeting, as well as other important updates:

- The Re-Opening Task Force (RTF) met on April 18, and presented several recommendations to the Session at its stated meeting on April 20. The session discussed and voted to approve each of the following:
 - -The use of Sign-up Genius for both the 9:00 and 11:00 worship services has been discontinued.
 - -The plastic curtain separating Decided from the congregation will continue to be used as an added layer o of precaution.
 - -The Re-opening Task Force has been dissolved. Any additional business will be handled by Session.
- The Christian Education Committee is pleased to announce the restart of Sunday School. Now in their third week, are classes for Children K-5 grade, Youth 6-12 grade, and adults. These classes will continue through May.
- The session approved a charitable gift of \$200 be given to Pittsburgh Theological Seminary in honor of both Pastor Jay and Pastor Casey. This donation (\$100 in each of their honors) was made in recognition of their Alumni celebration.
- The Connections Committee will once again be providing Friendship Bread to our visitors. All safety measures will be taken.
- The Outreach Committee planned and held a three day Yard Sale in order to raise funds to support a multitude of Outreach projects/missions.
- The Property Committee is pleased to announce that the outside of the church will soon be repainted. Work will begin soon.
- As a reminder, both the 9:00 and 11:00 services are live-streamed each Sunday.
- The Grace Group will soon be providing Communion for the homebound members of our congregation. If you are part of the College of Elders and wish to volunteer, please see Michelle Wentz or Doug MacColl.
- JPC will be hosting a small gathering in the picnic shelter for pastors of the Salem Presbytery on May 13 from 4:00-5:30pm.
