FOOD BOXES

JPC fills food boxes and delivers them to families who need help at Thanksgiving, Christmas, and Easter. At Christmas, we have an Angel Tree with all the families' names as the "angels." Members take names from the tree and purchase gifts for the children.

RISE AGAINST HUNGER (RISE): [Food Ministry International](#)

65 JPC volunteers prepare 10,000 meals in less than 2 hours right here in the church. These packaged meals are dehydrated, high in protein, and highly nutritious. Rise supports both educational programs and orphanages in 65 countries. Rise is working to impact hunger and death caused by hunger. In 2019, JPC reached the 100,000 meals packed mark!

Founded in 1967, GUM is a non-profit ecumenical agency supported by more than 200 congressional representatives. The GUM is a crisis intervention agency assisting the homeless with food, shelter, clothing, emergency assistance and more. JPC supports the GUM financially and prepares and serves meals at Potter House (GUM's on site community kitchen) for over the past fifteen years.

STREET MINISTRY

JPC distributes approximately 250 street ministry bags each year. The bags contain travel size items such as toothpaste, shampoo, soap, tissues, toothbrush, combs, crackers, socks, water, Bible verses and other seasonal items that can be of use.

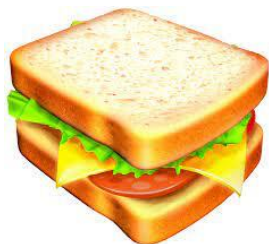
FEEDING LISA'S KIDS
