They attempt to combat this issue by running their own food pantry and by helping community households stretch their dollars at their thrift store. They also assist with home repair projects for those in need. This is where we get involved!

JPC will be heading to Sunset Gap May 8th-13th. This mission trip is much anticipated by anyone who has gone in the past. Sunset Gap is a great experience for people of all ages and all abilities. In the past, we have built wheelchair ramps and even helped build an entire house frame. But don't let big projects intimidate you! There are many ways to help when we partner with Sunset Gap. There are flowers that need planting and fences that need painting. We will need help from people who are comfortable in the kitchen to help keep us fed and energized to take on the day! No matter your skillset, God can use you! During down time on site, God allows for the opportunity to build relationships with the homeowners.

This time together is precious and will help our church group grow closer. 

PASTOR JAY'S SPRING BOOK CLUB

Since we are getting back into the swing of things Pastor Jay is pleased to announce that he will offer a 4 week book club starting in May. The group will meet Wednesdays at either 12:30 or 6:30. You will be able to float between the groups. The book we will be reading is entitled The Lions of Fifth Avenue by Fiona Davis. It is a work of fiction. This group is intended for fellowship and fun, not deep theological reflection.



Told in two timelines, The Lions of Fifth Avenue tells the stories of Laura Lyons (1913) and Sadie Donovan (1993) and their experiences at the New York City Public Library. In 1913, Laura's husband is the superintendent of the library, and their family actually lives in an apartment inside the library. Laura wants more from life and is bored at home with her two children, so she enrolls in journalism school and becomes involved with a radical group of women feminists meeting in Greenwich Village. Meanwhile, valuable books are stolen from the library and her family is under suspicion. In 1993, Sadie is the Curator at the New York City Public Library and also shares a secret connection with the famous essayist, Laura Lyons. The library experiences the theft of a few valuable pieces and Sadie's job is in jeopardy. Truths come to light regarding Sadie's family history as the case is investigated.

The group will meet May 18 & 25 and June 1 & 8. If you are interested in joining us, get your book and start reading! It is available at Amazon in paperback and also other places. Please notify the church office if you plane to attend or if you need help getting a book ordered. Hope to see you there.

The End of the Story

At the beginning of Lent Casey and I mentioned an article that I had read and passed on to her that asserted that this was the first Lent/Easter in three years. I remember that first COVID Easter morning. We managed to record a service at the columbarium. It was published sideways, it was cold, and it was the beginning of a crazy journey. I have been so overjoyed by your attendance, response to fundraisers and special offerings, and your participation in Lenten programming here at the church. The last two years have been a journey, but this Lent has been a season of renewal and hope as we make our way to the cross and the empty tomb.

I have truly enjoyed our Wednesday study of the crucifixion of Jesus. It has been challenging and at times I have not agreed with the author, but it has been powerful to consider for a moment all the individuals present on that day. The best part for me has been getting to discuss the reading with you and opening the Bible with you each week. I have also loved getting to hear your thoughts and experiences. While the reading was academic and it was hard to relive that day over and over again for six weeks it was tolerable because we know that the crucifixion (Good Friday) is not the end of the story.

Perhaps this is what gets us through daily life as Christians? We know that God has a plan for us and that this life is not the end! I think that throughout COVID, a war, and inflation we should remember that this world is only temporary and that there is victory in Christ Jesus. The worst day of our lives is not the end of the story. The prophet Jeremiah writes, "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." That hope and that future all begin in Jesus.

Don't forget to attend the Easter Egg Hunt with your children, grandchildren, neighbors, or whomever! Also remember the Cantata on Maundy Thursday. There will be 3 services on Easter Sunday: 6:30AM Sunrise in the picnic shelter, 9AM contemporary in the CLC, and I IAM traditional in the Sanctuary.

These last few days of Lent let us all remember that in John 14 Jesus told the disciples that he was going to prepare a place, that he will return, and that there is room for all of us. Also remember that God loves each of us so much that he sent Jesus to restore us in His death. This world is tough and could even be getting tougher but through the morning daybreak light on that first Easter we can see that God is in control and that we are His.
