Remember to Remember

May is a busy month. We find ourselves finishing up so many things in preparation for a summer of relaxation and travel. In the Smith household this year we celebrate a "Sweet 16," prepare for the graduation of our first child, and of course celebrate mom. I decided this year that I would not be writing a Mother's Day newsletter article, not because it isn't a worthy topic but because I have done it the last several years and wanted to try something new. We thank you for all your caring attention over the years and for crafting each of us into the people we are today!

Each year, my family participates in the Pilgrimage Beach Weekend over the Memorial Day weekend. In the Bible, especially the Old Testament, there are several instances of the Israelites making memorials to intentionally remember something that took place in a location or something God did for them. This Memorial Day I will be at the beach, but I will be intentional. I will take a moment to thank God for the freedoms we enjoy due to the hard work and sacrifices of others. Dear Friends and Family at JPC,

I will never forget my first preaching Sunday as part of JPC staff. Jay and Erin had planned a few days away to celebrate a wedding anniversary on a cruise. I was to preach on Sunday Feb. 10. On Saturday night, Feb. 9, my dad died. I was trying to be stoic and said I would preach, but the folks from this church would not hear of it. I remember talking to Becky Brown and to Kerry Miller that Saturday night who told me to stay home. They said they would take care of everything on Sunday. And so it was done. I think Sammie did the sermon that Sunday, from what I heard, and God was worshiped and glorified! I learned that night that JPC takes care of her people. Probably one of the greatest strengths of this congregation is that they take good care of their pastors and staff, too!

In stepping down as your Parish Associate, I have had time to recall so many different times that people of this church have blessed me and my family. I will never forget, nor be able to thank you enough for the generous and loving ways you cared for both my mom and dad in my absence. It was hard living far away from our families when we lived in California and just as hard when we lived closer but still not close enough during our time in Illinois and Indiana. I have loved getting to know many of you. We have shared times together in homes, in hospitals, on outings, in worship, on Session, in meetings and in studies together. That's a lot of caring and sharing over these last 3-plus years together. Thank-you for letting me be a part of your lives and your ministry.

I feel like God has brought me full circle in many ways. From California back to North Carolina where Art and I first met. From pharmacist to pastor. And today, April 27, 2022, as I write to you my thoughts on retirement, I also celebrate the anniversary of my Ordination. In so many ways God has been faithful to you and just as importantly through you.

I am reminded of a note I received from a friend on my Ordination:
