THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR JAY

During Lent we have looked at the questions of Jesus. We attempted to understand that Jesus loves us but as followers of Christ there are ways that we can serve God and others each day. There should also be a desire to become more Christlike every day. This month we celebrate Easter. There is a lot of work that goes into the Lenten season, and it culminates with Holy Week, Good Friday, and of course



Easter Morning. We are already working on Palm Sunday with the kids, an Easter egg hunt for the community, and the backdrop has been decorated in the CLC so you can take photos with your family in their Easter best! You can join us for our Sunrise service at 6:30 in the pavilion or at the normal 9AM CLC service or 11AM in the Sanctuary.

I thought it would be good to go over some of the Easter greatest hits in this article so that you could spend the next couple of weeks really focused on just what God did for each of us on Easter morning. Easter is the central event in the Christian faith. While Christmas has gained popularity due to presents and commercialism, it is Easter that gives us our meaning. Easter is a celebration of Jesus' resurrection, a central tenet of our faith, marking the victory over death and the promise of eternal life for believers.

Holy week is the week leading up to Easter. This is the week that Jesus was in Jerusalem, and this is when his fate is sealed. He and the disciples make their way there for the Passover and they enter in dramatic fashion. Remember that Jesus sent his disciples to get a donkey for Jesus to ride in on? Why is this special? For several reasons: First, the disciples go and get this colt that has never been ridden. This shows Jesus' power in that he rode this unbroken beast into the city. Have you ever seen a western tv show or movie where they are breaking horses? They buck and do everything in their power to throw the rider off. It is Jesus' holy gentleness that makes him able to ride this thing immediately. Just the fact that the owner immediately responds in the affirmative when he is told that the Master needs it, shows that there is something special going on here. And then let's talk about the crowd and his entrance. They give him a royal welcome. I kind of envision it like a celebration parade when the hometown team has won the big game. The crowd is so loud, and they praise him as a king. This will also be what seals his fate with the Pharisees.

Holy Week also gives us Maundy Thursday and Good Friday. Please join us on Maundy Thursday evening for our cantata. Maundy Thursday is a special day in the life of the church. It is one that we celebrate and learn from every time we celebrate the Lord's Supper because this is the night that Jesus gave this meal to his disciples and to us. Maundy Thursday is one of my favorite services for this very reason.

Even though we don't have a service on Good Friday, this is the day that we remember (probably celebrate isn't the right word) Jesus' death on the cross. This is a day about loving sacrifice. Jesus endured that hardship to honor and serve God, the Father. He paid the price for our sins and He justified us before God. There is nothing we could ever do to earn this, it was only through God's grace and Jesus' completed action that we are forgiven.

By the grace of God, Good Friday is not the end of the story. Easter Sunday is the day of resurrection. It is the day that every question about Jesus is answered because he is alive. It is the day that we are marked as clean and clear if we turn to God for our salvation. The symbols of Easter are the empty tomb and the empty cross. The empty cross has become the symbol we associate with the risen Christ. That's why none of the crosses in our church have a crucifix on them. Jesus on the cross was not the end of the story.

As we make our way through April and Holy Week, may we remember how important these things are in that they made our lives have meaning. It is only in the resurrected Christ that we have meaning in life. Focus on him these last days of Lent. Give thanks to God for the events and symbols of our faith that draw us closer to God. Call upon the Spirit to grow in your relationship with the Lord this Easter. See you in church.

We wanted to share with you the news that Session recently approved a change to the vacation package for Pastor Jay.
