

When I say there is a job for everyone, I mean we can find you something that you can do to make this day a huge success. You may not know this, but I worked at amusement parks when I was in college. I worked at Kennywood in Pittsburgh and Cedar Point in Sandusky, Ohio over my college career. At Kennywood I worked at The Golden Nugget. It was an ice cream place that sold an ice cream cone that was square and dipped in chocolate and peanuts. There were two jobs that you did not want to get in this establishment. I love watching the kids watch Tony and I bag up that sugary goodness before we hand it to them. It is one of my favorite times on this campus. 

The JPC Community Garden is still producing a lot of tomatoes, okra, green beans and peppers. We have not had any luck with squash this year probably due to all of the rain and some squash vine borers! Stop by the garden and pick up some okra and tomatoes for the following recipe.

We are looking forward to a little cooler weather and planting some fall crops soon. Thanks to all of our new volunteers that have kept things going so well over the summer! Roasted Shrimp With Okra and Tomatoes Recipe

- · 1 pound (21 to 30 count) peeled and deveined shrimp (tails on)
- · 2 tablespoons dried oregano
- · ½ tablespoon smoked paprika
- · Salt and black pepper
- · ½ cup olive oil
- · 1 pound small to medium okra, trimmed
- · 1 pint cherry tomatoes

Step 1 Heat the oven to 450 degrees and line a sheet pan with aluminum foil. In a medium bowl, combine the shrimp, oregano, smoked paprika, a few pinches of salt and 2 tablespoons of olive oil. Mix well and set aside.

Step 2 Add the okra and tomatoes to the pan, season with salt and several cracks of black pepper, then drizzle the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil over top. Mix well, spread evenly then place on the top rack of the oven. Roast until the okra is softened and the tomatoes are soft and have released their juices, about 15 minutes.

Step 3 Take the pan out of the oven, put the tomatoes and okra in a large bowl, then spread the shrimp evenly on the same pan and toss to coat in the pan juices. Return the pan to the oven and roast until the shrimp are cooked through, 4 to 5 minutes.

Step 4 Remove the shrimp from the oven, then toss with the okra and tomatoes, along with any pan juices. Taste for salt. Serve on a large platter and finish with a squeeze of lemon.
